Committee Descriptions

ACROY (AFMS Club Rockhound of the Year) — The Committee invites each club in the RMFMS to submit a resume of one of their adult rock hound members or a married couple, and a junior member they would like to honor by giving recognition through the Rocky Mountain Federation News. This information is also forwarded to the AFMS Chairperson to be published in the AFMS Newsletter each year.

All American Club — This Committee conducts the RMFMS Club Awards contest in conjunction with the AFMS. Clubs keep a club "yearbook" that highlights the club's activities for the past year, including group activities, individual member participation, workshops, and shows. Keeping a yearbook is an organized way to keep a historical record of activities for your club, and the award provides national recognition.

BEAC (Bulletin Editors Advisory & Bulletin Editors Contest) — This Committee works with club bulletin editors to provide resources for better editing and is responsible for conducting the "Bulletin Editors Contest" each year. There are categories for different size bulletins, adult articles, adult articles advanced, junior articles, written features, drawn features, photo collage, adult poetry, junior poetry, and special publications. The top three winners in each category are sent to AFMS for judging at the national level. This is how we honor the hard work of our editors and authors and is another way to promote good communication.

Boundaries — This Committee represents the Federation in committee meetings with the American Federation and the other Regional Federations regarding shared boundary concerns.

Convention Advisor — This is the liaison between the Federation as a whole and the Host Club in Convention matters of mutual concern in accordance with the RMFMS Convention Code.

Credentials — The Credentials Committee receives and records the names of the delegates and alternates to the RMFMS Convention House of Delegates meeting submitted on the appropriate forms by each affiliated society. The committee certifies the credentials of all delegates and alternates and the validity of all proxies at the convening of the House of Delegates.

iDirectory — This Committee assembles information provided by Federation officers and committees and edits and publishes the annual Directory.

Committee Descriptions CONT...

Editor — The RMFMS Editor creates the RMFMS Newsletter, which is published 10 times per year. There are no issues published in June and July. One or two people in each club will receive the newsletter via email. They are asked to forward it to all other members of their club. The newsletter contains informative articles from the RMFMS President, Treasurer, and often other Committee Chairs. It also provides information about contests, how to apply, and winners. Shows, regional and national rock hounding concerns, and interesting articles are also included

Finance — This Committee audits the treasurer's books before the Annual Convention and when they are turned over to a new treasurer.

Fluorescent Tech — This Committee will furnish news stories to the RMFMS Newsletter and handles requests for information on this phase of the hobby.

Fossils Tech — This Committee will furnish news stories to the RMFMS Newsletter and answers requests regarding the fossil phase of the hobby.

Gold Pan Award — This Committee consists of three people who have previously received this award. The Committee may or may not select a recipient each year. More than one award may be presented each year. The Committee will select individuals, who in the Committee's opinion, have performed outstanding service to the RMFMS. The recipients need not be RMFMS officers. The vote of the Committee will be unanimous

Insurance — This Committee will procure and service liability insurance for clubs. See details about the policy on the RMFMS Insurance page.

International Relations — International Relations works with the AFMS Chairperson in compiling a list of places of interest for Federation members who plan to travel abroad and handles requests for information from foreign sources.

Juniors Program — This Committee shall actively encourage juniors to become involved in rockhounding activities and to participate in local and regional shows. The AFMS has the Future Rockhounds of America program, in which our Federation participates. This program has themes, suggestions for leaders to carry out the program themes, and badges the juniors may earn for doing specific tasks in each category. The AFMS provides the materials & badges at no cost to clubs. AFMS also has a Juniors Website, www.juniors.amfed.org.

Lapidary Tech — Furnishes lapidary news stories to the RMFMS Newsletter and handles members' requests for information.

Long Range Planning — Studies and makes recommendations regarding changes in the By-Laws and Operating Procedures.

Committee Descriptions CONT...

Mineralogical Tech — Has the responsibility for furnishing mineralogical news to the RMFMS Newsletter and answering information requests regarding the mineral aspect of the hobby.

Name Badges - Procures name badges for new officers and committee chairs.

New Program Contest — This Committee conducts the RMFMS Competition for new programs. The Program Competition is to encourage the production of earth science programs related to the rock hound hobby by the individual members and member clubs of the various federations through the visual arts program competitions. Regional Federations are supplied with copies of the award-winning programs that become part of each regional program library.

Nominations — The Nominating Committee presents a slate of officers for all elective positions to the House of Delegates (nominations can also be made from the floor).

Parliamentarian — Answers questions concerning rules of order and ensures that Federation meetings are conducted according to Robert's Rules of Order.

PLAC (Public Lands Advisory Committee) — PLAC keeps Federation members advised of Federal and State land use regulations that affect our hobby and makes recommendations for individual action.

President's Hat — This Committee is comprised of all RMFMS past presidents. During the RMFMS Awards Banquet they meet to decide if the current president has worn the President's Hat according to the RMFMS criteria. Any fines charged and paid are donated to the Scholarship Foundation.

Program Library — Provides slide, video, CD, and DVD programs to clubs that request them, for a charge that covers the cost of insurance, postage, and handling.

Public Relations — This Committee will encourage clubs and individuals to be involved in activities and projects that present our hobby, the RMFMS, and member clubs to the public in a positive light.

Ribbons - Procures ribbons for awards at shows.

Safety — Will furnish safety articles for the RMFMS Newsletter and safety suggestions to member clubs dealing with all aspects of the hobby, such as field trips involving mines, desert, and mountain trips.

Scholarship — Accepts donations from individual members and clubs. Coordinates with the AFMS Scholarship Foundation Fund in all matters pertaining to Scholarship activities. See the AFMS Scholarship Foundation page for details.

Stationery and Trophies — Orders the stationery for official use and orders the trophies for RMFMS awards at shows.

Committee Descriptions CONT...

Supplies — This Committee is responsible for maintaining an adequate inventory of RMFMS and AFMS supplies that may be ordered by member clubs or individual members and distributes supplies to new clubs.

Uniform Rules — This Committee works in close cooperation with the AFMS Rules Committee in maintaining up-to-date rules concerning competitive exhibiting in local, regional, and national shows. It cooperates with member clubs in interpreting rules and assists with competitive judging at Regional and National Shows.

Webmaster — The webmaster establishes and maintains a Web Page for the RMFMS with information of interest about and for the Federation. https://www.rmfms.org

Website Contest — Coordinates the entries for the Webmaster contest. Contest applications and score sheets are available on the RMFMS website (see above), under Resources-Contest Forms

Rocky Mountain Federation of Mineralogical Societies

Purpose & Policies

- 1. To bring about a closer association of the Earth Science Groups in the Rocky Mountain region.
- 2. To increase and disseminate knowledge about minerals and other geologic materials.
- 3. To encourage mineral study, collecting, and fashioning as a HOBBY.
- 4. To sponsor local organizations interested in similar purposes.

Federation Projects

- 1. To publish the Rocky Mountain Federation News to keep all clubs informed of the services and benefits provided by the Federation, furnish information on regional activities and articles of interest to hobbyists.
- 2. To encourage all clubs to publish bulletins and newsletters.
- 3. To continue building up and promoting the use of the Federation Library of slide programs, videos, CDs, and DVDs to each member club.
- 4. To distribute information and suggestions on he preparation and arrangement of specimens and materials for exhibit and display.
- 5. To provide information and assistance to clubs holding Gem and Mineral Shows.
- 6. To cooperate with and render all possible assistance to Host Clubs of the RMFMS Show and Convention.
- 7. To keep an up-to-date Job Description for each officer and committee person, outlining the operations, duties, and responsibilities of each office and committee. These will be passed on to the next person to hold that office. It will serve to acquaint them with the nature of the job before taking office.
- 8. To prepare a budget for all activities and to operate with a budget control system.

Rocky Mountain Federation of Mineralogical Societies Cont....

- 9. To encourage committees to research areas of interest and to submit at least three articles for publication in the RMFMS Newsletter and prepare a report for the RMFMS convention.
- 10. To distribute the "Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws" and membership forms to all State Directors for use in recruiting new clubs.
- 11. To submit problems of a broad or lasting nature of the Long Range Planning Committee for evaluation and appropriate action.
- 12. To prepare and distribute a Federation Directory to all member clubs, committee chairpersons, and officers.
- 13. To encourage clubs to support the American Federation of Mineralogical Societies Scholarship Foundation Fund.
- 14. To promote education in the Earth Sciences among all members of the Federation.
- 15. To encourage all member clubs to develop a club project to engage all members.
- 16. To promote the concept that all members of all clubs are members of the RMFMS and the AFMS, and to encourage individual members and clubs to take responsibility for asking questions or making known that help is needed. To encourage more contacts between those working at the Federation level, between clubs, and between club members.
- 17. To hold at least one unofficial Federation meeting at a local show so members can meet with Federation Officers, Committee Chairpersons, and State Directors.
- 18. Edit the Operating Procedures as needed.
- 19. Keep the members informed of problems and activities regarding the use of Public Lands
- 20. To Continue to support Federation sponsored programs.
- 21. To develop use of email and to encourage use of our web page at the following address: http://www.rmfms.org.

Rocky Mountain Federation of Mineralogical Societies Cont....

Organization

The Rocky Mountain Federation is composed of a membership of approximately 9000 members in the following states: Arizona, Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Nebraska, New Mexico, Nevada, North Dakota, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Texas, Utah, and Wyoming.

The work of the Federation is directed by the Executive Committee, composed of: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Historian, State Directors, and the two immediate Past- Presidents. The officers and half of the State Directors are elected annually by the House of Delegates at the Annual Convention. The Historian is elected every five years.

The State Directors that are elected in the even years are: Arkansas, Colorado, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas, Utah, and Wyoming. State Directors elected in the odd years are: Arizona, Nevada, Kansas, Nebraska, North Dakota, and South Dakota.

Finances

Member clubs pay annual dues of \$1.50 per member. Of this amount, \$0.55 goes to pay dues to the American Federation of Mineralogical Societies. RMFMS typically runs a budget surplus of several thousand dollars. The surplus is deposited in our savings account or our bond fund. The earnings from our investments are donated to the AFMS Scholarship Foundation. The donation this year was \$5,300. The RMFMS also has a Liability Insurance program that each club has the option to participate in at the cost of \$0.60 per member. See the RMFMS Insurance description for details.

No one in the RMFMS receives a salary. The officers and committee members are provided with stationery and allowed reimbursement for postage and some phone calls. These people pay their own expenses of attending Federation meetings and donate hundreds of hours of service and skills to the Federation.

Three AFMS delegates from the RMFMS, President, Uniform Rules and Boundaries Chair receive partial reimbursement of their expenses to attend the American Federation of Mineralogical Societies Convention.

The President's HAT

It has come to my attention that some members of the Rocky Mountain Federation are unaware of the tradition behind the President's HAT which is worn by RMFMS Presidents at the RMFMS and AFMS meetings as well as other functions. When I first became President in November of 2005, I asked Howie Whiting to write a history of the HAT to be published in the Rocky Mountain Federation Newsletter, so that people would understand it's history and significance. He did for the January 2006 issue of our Newsletter. Please read it as it has pertinent information beyond what I knew. [excerpts from Howie's article are included in this posting]

However, I want to add to the information since it is now over eleven years old. I have spoken with each of the RMFMS Past Presidents who have served since 2006. I want all of you to know that none of them consider the tradition of the HAT to be bullying, hazing, intimidating, or coercing, In fact each considers it a privilege and an honor to have been able to wear the HAT and are supportive of the tradition. The HAT originally belonged to Ralph Platt, who was President of the RMFMS in 1954-55. Ralph was a much beloved person in our Federation and just passed away two or three years he was well up into his 90s. In 1986 the Federation Show and Convention was held in Arizona. On one of the field trips Alice Smith, who was the RMFMS Vice President, forgot to bring her hat. Alice had health problems and needed to have her head shaded from the Arizona summer sun, so Ralph gave his hat to her. That is the hat that became and still is the President's HAT. The HAT was worn by Presidents from 1987 through 1995 without an Operating Procedure concerning it. It was determined that an OP was needed and it was written primarily by John Alf, a past RMFMS President who passed away in his 90s. It was adopted at the Delegates meeting in 1995.

Now, what else is positive about the HAT? When the person wearing the HAT walks into a Rocky Mountain or American Federation meeting, the others there know who he or she is. It is the symbol of leadership in the RMFMS. When I first attended the big Denver Show as President, most of the people there didn't know me yet. But they recognized the HAT and knew I was the President. Rockhounds from several clubs came up, introduced themselves, talked with me, and told me how glad they were that I was there supporting their show. This is something that is repeated at shows and meetings all over the Rocky Mountain Federation and in other Federations as well. I certainly discovered this when I was AFMS Vice President and President and had to attend Regional Federation Shows all across the United States. When I became RMFMS President in 2005, I determined that I was going to have as much fun as I could with the HAT and try to rack up the largest fine yet given for improper wearing of the HAT (but I was too good in Stillwater in 2006 and only got fined maybe (\$20.00)

The fine is paid to the AFMS Scholarship Foundation, which is able to award \$48,000 in Scholarships each year to graduate Geoscience students. I succeeded the next year by doing all I could to bait the Past Presidents, who make up the HAT Committee. In Roswell in 2007 during the Awards Banquet while the Committee was meeting, I decided to wear the hat on my hand instead of my head and said I wasn't fearful of getting fined because the Past Presidents were 'actually just a bunch of teddy bears.

The President's HAT Cont....

I was assessed a \$40 fine, which I promptly blamed on my wife Linda, who was sitting next to me at head table, saying she was the one who had forced me to do these things. At that point she informed the committee that I had moved Federation property from my car to the hotel while not wearing the hat; the fine increased to \$50. When I was President again in 2016, I decided that I wanted to break my record for the largest fine yet assessed by baiting the Past Presidents even further. I really had fun with the HAT. I also enjoyed decorating the HAT with various bands, feathers, Navajo and Cherokee pins, etc.

Stan Nowak served as President after me. He wore the HAT not only to the 2008 RMFMS Convention in Tulsa but to club meetings and shows all over our area. Another member of his club, John Worden, made sure to report to the President's Hat Committee if Stan failed to wear the HAT. He tells me that he was fined maybe \$20 or \$25. The following year in 2009, because of health reasons, Stan was unable to attend the Convention in Roswell. Yonis Lone Eagle was the Vice President at the time and so at the Delegates meeting, the OP was amended to designate the Vice President to wear the HAT in the absence of the President. Yonis did so with distinction, and I don't think he was fined.

Bill Smith followed as the next President and was almost perfect in the wearing of the HAT. Bill found, as I had, that when he attended the Denver Show and shows or meetings elsewhere, including meetings in other AFMS Regions, that people knew who he was and what he represented. People talked to him and told him how much they appreciated his being at their functions. Now, it seems that Bill's wife, Janet, felt he should be fined over something, so she told Bob Carlson that Bill took the HAT off when he took a shower at the Colorado Springs Show – thus a fine of \$10. Bill is a very strong supporter of the tradition of the President's HAT.

DeLane Cox loved the HAT, too, and decorated it with peacock feathers, a band with sequins, and an amethyst hat pin. She actually did a pretty good job of wearing the hat with just a few slip-ups. She recalls that her fines were about \$20 at the Federation Shows in both Albuquerque and Sandy, Utah. Now, the AFMS Show in Jacksonville, Florida was another matter. I managed to get pictures of DeLane minus hat at a couple of official functions. I think we fined her maybe another \$10.

Diane Weir followed DeLane. Diane is Howie Whiting's daughter and so of course understood about the HAT. I think she had as much fun with the HAT as I did and tried to break my record for a fine by baiting the Past Presidents just like I did. In Tulsa the HAT appeared on the Vice President, Jeri House, at an official function and in Cody, Wyoming it appeared on Ben Thomas, the husband of our RMFMS Secretary at the Awards Banquet so, of course, fines were assessed. Diane really decorated the HAT. It was adorned with fancy broach pins, crystals, flowers, and beaded bands to match the colors of different outfits she wore.

Liz Thomas proudly wore the hat to all functions and adorned it with a head band that she designed and her husband Ben made from seed beads. You can see it in the RMFMS Past President's case..

The President's HAT Cont...

Bob Regner really looked stunning in his hat. He did try hard to get a good fine but the hat looked so much better on he rarely took it off. His band was made of stones in the shape of each state from a mine that he has in New Mexico. His wife Donna provided the material to Ben Thomas who cut the states out and they put them on leather. It looks awesome

Sheri Johnson is the last President at this time to wear the hat. She did everything in her power to get a fine as large or larger than Richard Jaeger but she missed it by \$1.00. Her hat was made up of states cut out of stones from that state. Jodi Brewster came up with the ides and she spear headed to get this accomplished. Sheri added the alien for New Mexico. Very cute.

Here are excerpts from Howie Whiting's article about the HAT in the 2006 RMFMS News. One Past President has described it as "Priceless."

"Ask any military man and he will tell you that a hat is a symbol of authority and prestige. But ask a desert rat and he will tell you a hat is a necessity for survival. Both are correct as was well known by Ralph Platt, a Past President of the Rocky Mountain Federation. Ralph led many field trips into the deserts of Arizona and New Mexico wearing an old felt hat with a wide brim. However, on one of those trips a young lady by the name of Alice Smith was having trouble, and Ralph presented her with his hat telling her to wear it with pride as it was assisting her to survive. Alice did wear the hat and, to honor Ralph, wore it as President of the RMFMS during the AFMS/RMFMS show in Oklahoma City in 1987.

Now it so happened that at that show a group of individuals including myself was trying to find a way to raise money to present the Big Topaz to the Smithsonian. When I asked Dixie Alf for a donation, she replied that if I wore the HAT during the Banquet she would donate \$25.00 to the fund. I agreed ,so there I was, sitting at the head table with my wife in formal dress and me in my Sunday-Go-To-Meeting clothes, wearing the HAT. Several people commented, but not too loudly. Dixie paid the \$25.00.

The next morning Alice Smith and Jim Howell, President of the AFMS, gave me, as the incoming RMFMS President, the HAT and gave instructions to wear it on as many occasions as possible. Unfortunately this conversation was overheard by John Mastin, the New Mexico State Director who, upon returning to Roswell, informed the Chaparral Rockhounds that I was to wear the HAT at ALL Functions. He also suggested that the club assist me in performing this honor by fining me a dollar for the Scholarship Fund for any Function I attended without the HAT. Further, he defined a Function as any occasion where there were three or more Rockhounds present.

Think about it! If I opened the door of my home and a man and wife (rockhounds) were there, I made three and didn't have the HAT on. If I stepped out of my trailer when camping and two people were outside, I made three without the HAT on. Standing in line at the pharmacy waiting for my prescription, I would turn around and see two smiling couples from the club and me without the HAT.

The President's HAT Cont...

And at every club meeting John would present the bill for that month's sins of omission. By the end of the year I would get up in the morning, put the HAT on, and then reach for my pants. Finally, my term was up and I could pass the HAT to my successor.

My wife and I flew to Bismarck, ND with the HAT in the luggage. Wouldn't you know, when we arrived at the hotel to check in, there was John Mastin with notebook in hand along with two smiling rockhounds.

However, I did pass it on to my successor, Earl Campbell, at the Pitchfork Fondue along with suggestions to his club. We don't know his performance since ND is so far north that we couldn't check up on him, but it was reported he did wear the HAT at most functions.

That wasn't the case with his successor. Aldine Fireng of El Paso filled the HAT with newspapers since it was too large for her. Unfortunately during the hot summer months a certain amount of moisture was generated, the ink ran, and Aldine had the craziest hair coloring you ever saw. Her husband was not amused. However, Aldine solved the problem in true executive fashion by replacing the newspaper with the more practical toilet paper, shampooed her hair, and soldiered on. She was watched closely and did her duty.

Dan Lingelbach wore the HAT at most functions and passed it on to Art Pavin who liked it so much it was reported) he wore it to bed. This was never confirmed, however. Dixie Lee Alf inherited the HAT and wondered what Federation regulation required it. All she could see was an undefined group of self-appointed old codgers, acting without any authority. She was right. The HAT had been voluntary and most President's were supportive. But what would happen if one simply refused to wear the HAT? Something had to be done! Several meetings of Past Presidents were held and finally John Alf suggested an OP. Since he suggested it, he got to write it. In 1995 John presented his OP to the House of Delegates and moved that it be adopted. There was a rather lively discussion. The incoming President Bob Carlson voted against the motion, it passed with a large margin. The HAT was now official with rules and sanctions for noncompliance. Richard Goodnough was the last President to wear the HAT unsupervised. . .

By now the HAT had made the AFMS circuit two times. It had been in the State of Washington and in the Deep South, it had traveled to New York, California, and points in between. When seen it was immediately recognized as being worn by the President of the RMFMS and given respect. For it takes a certain amount of courage to wear the HAT, just as it takes a certain amount of courage to be President of the RMFMS.

But the HAT finally spoke for itself. It was tired. It had been worn by fifteen Presidents, performing its duty, and it showed. The hatband was frayed and cracked, and the lining was hanging out the back. It needed help. The Committee voted to have the HAT refurbished. This has been done, and the HAT rejuvenated!" ~Howie Whiting









American Federation Code of Ethics

I will respect both private and public property and will do no collecting on privately owned land without permission from the owner.

I will keep informed on all laws, regulations or rules governing collecting on public lands and will observe them.

I will, to the best of my ability, ascertain the boundary lines of property on which I plan to collect.

I will use no firearms or blasting material in collecting areas.

I will cause no willful damage to property of any kind such as fences, signs, buildings, etc.

I will leave all gates as found.

I will build fires only in designated or safe places and will be certain they are completely extinguished before leaving the area.

I will discard no burning material - matches, cigarettes, etc.

I will fill excavation holes which may be dangerous to livestock.

I will not contaminate wells, creeks, or other water supplies.

I will cause no willful damage to collecting material and will take home only what I can reasonably use.

I will practice conservation and undertake to utilize fully and well the materials I have collected and will recycle my surplus for the pleasure and benefit of others.

I will support the rockhound project H.E.L.P. (Help Eliminate Litter Please) and will leave all collecting areas devoid of litter, regardless of how found.

I will cooperate with field-trip leaders and those in designated authority in all collecting areas.

I will report to my Club or Federation Officers, Bureau of Land Management or other authorities, any deposit of petrified wood or other materials on public lands which should be protected for the enjoyment of future generations for public educational and scientific purposes.

I will appreciate and protect our heritage of natural resources.

I will observe the "Golden Rule", will use Good Outdoor Manners and will at all times conduct myself in a manner which will add to the stature and Public Image of Rockhounds everywhere

RMFMS Information

The Rocky Mountain Federation of Mineralogical Societies (RMFMS) is one of the seven Federations that are members of the American Federation of Mineralogical Societies.

The AFMS also has the California, South Central, Southeastern, Eastern, Midwest and Northwest Federations.

The RMFMS has approximately 13,800 members within societies and clubs in thirteen states - Arizona, Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Texas, Utah and Wyoming.

RMFMS Business

Each year the RMFMS holds an annual convention where business is discussed and voted on, and new officers are elected. It is held in association with a member club's Show. Clubs petition to host these shows and the Executive Committee selects them. Conventions are spread across the Federation so members can attend and visit different parts of the country when they attend the convention. Every seventh year the RMFMS hosts the AFMS annual convention in conjunction with the RMFMS convention and show.

Executive Committee and Delegates

The RMFMS is supervised by an Executive Committee, composed of elected officers and State Directors. All business is carried out in the House of Dele-gates meeting. If no member from a club can represent a club at the Delegate meeting, it can designate a proxy to voice their wishes. A good candidate for a proxy vote might be a State Director or another RMF officer attending the convention. An Information packet about the convention is sent to each club about two months prior to the meeting. Delegate, Alternate and Proxy forms are included.

State Directors

State Directors, who are members of the Executive Committee of the RMFMS, are members selected to help clubs within their state. If any club has a question or problem, a call to the SD may help solve the problem. If not, the State Director knows other people to contact for help. State Directors are encouraged to stay in Close contact with all of the clubs in their state to assist when needed. All State Directors contact information is listed in each published Officers List.

RMFMS Information Cont....

Rules to go by

If anyone is interested in what the rules for the RMFMS are, the RMFMS.org website has the By-Laws and Operating Procedures that can be downloaded. One copy of these documents should be in each club's library. Also in the library should be the RMFMS Articles of Incorporation.

Helpful Committees

There are also Special Committees and Standing Committees for the RMFMS to assist in running the Federation and keep all clubs informed about Lapidary interests. If a club or member has a question about a particular lapidary skill, piece of equipment, or needs a rock identified, there is someone on the Committees list to help with that. The list is in this publication, and appears monthly in the RMFMS newsletter.

Membership & Insurance

Clubs that are members of the RMFMS renew their membership each November. Membership costs for this year were \$ 1.50 per member, excluding life-time Members. The Federation also has a Liability Insurance program that each club has the option to participate in at the cost of 60 cents per member. For more information see the Insurance page in this booklet.

Program Library

The Federation has many sources of information and help for every club. One of the most helpful is the Program Library, composed of CDs, DVDs and slide programs that may be rented for a reasonable fee from the Program Library. The list of titles has been published to assist Clubs in selecting a program. These make good club programs at a very reasonable cost. Contact the Program Librarian, as listed in the RMFMS Committees list, to secure a program.

RMFMS Information Cont....

Membership Directory

Each Club also receives a copy of the annual Membership Directory, listing every club in the Federation plus other information about the RMFMS and the clubs. Clubs are listed by state, by city, and have the current officers and contacts. It also lists the dates for their annual show. If a member is going to be in a certain part of the country, they may look up the closest club and see if there are any field trips or shows on the schedule. Copies of the Directory are sent out after its publication, and extra copies are available for a small fee from the Supplies Chair.

Newsletters

The Rocky Mountain Newsletter is published 10 times a year, and is sent to every club. One or two people in the club receive the newsletter email. They are asked to forward it to all other members of their club. The newsletter contains informative articles from the RMFMS president, treasurer, and often other Committee Chairs. There is information about Federation contests such as deadlines, applications and tips for filling them out. After awards have been presented at the Convention, the results of the contests are included in the Newsletter. In addition to the RMFMS Newsletter, every club receives copies of the AFMS Newsletter that is sent to three officers of each club. This helps all clubs and members keep up with what is happening on the national rockhound arena. Both the RMFMS and the AFMS Newsletters may also be found on their respective websites. The AFMS also publishes the Uniform Rules that are the guidelines for competitive case judging. These may be downloaded from the AFMS website, but be aware: it is lengthy.

Youth Program

If your club has youth members, the AFMS has the Future Rockhounds of America program in which our Federation participates. This excellent program has themes, suggestions for leaders to carry out the program themes, and badges the young members may earn for doing specific tasks in each category. Information.

Scholarship Program

The Rocky Mountain Federation participates in the AFMS Scholarship Foundation program that clubs are asked to support financially. The Foundation provides two \$4000 scholarships annually to the six participating Federations

Contests

One of the fun parts of the RMFMS has to be the contests held each year. Clubs can send entries into the publications contest, the website contest, the All American Club contest and the Programs contest. In addition, members can submit competition cases for judging. Winners for all of these awards are given out at the annual convention. There is more information on these competitions on following pages.

YOUTH BADGE PROGRAM

The Badge Program is one of many American Federation of Mineralogical Society (AFMS) Future Round hounds of America (FRA) programs designed for club to use in working with youth. The program is designed to reward youth with a series of badges, patches, and a completion pin. For each badge, there are easy to use activity guides. This program is only available to clubs or societies affiliated with the AFMS and FRA. The program is free to AFMS affiliated clubs including the patches, badges, pins, and downloadable material.



AFMS Scholarship Foundation, Inc.

Organization:

The AFMS Scholarship Foundation, authorized in the by-laws of the American Federation of Mineralogical Societies, was incorporated as a Minnesota corporation on March 19, 1964, and is tax exempt. Six of the AFMS Regional Federations participate in the Foundation. The Southeastern Federation has its own scholarship foundation and does not participate.

Board of Directors:

The Board is made up of the President and Vice-President from each of the six participating federations. They elect a President, Treasurer, and Secretary each for a term of two years. The President of the AFMS is automatically the Vice President of the Foundation. The annual business meeting is held once a year, immediately after the close of the AFMS annual business meeting.

Contributions and Gifts:

Contributions or gifts to the Foundation should be sent to the Rocky Mountain Federation Scholarship Chairman: Richard Jaeger, 3515 E. 88th St., Tulsa OK 74137-2602. Please make the checks out to the AFMS Scholarship Foundation. Gifts from individuals are tax deductible to the donor.

Recognition to Donors:

Special recognition is given to each Federation Club when contributions equal or surpass \$1.00 per dues- paying member. This recognition begins with the 100% when contributions total \$1.00 member for the total number of club members and can advance on to 200%, 300%, etc. The percentages are based on the number (including junior members) in the Club as shown in the current year's RMFMS Directory, not the number of members there happen to be in the Club at the time the check is sent in. This basis is used consistently for all clubs throughout the Federation and remains in effect until the next Directory comes out. The percentages for all of the contributing RMFMS Clubs are given on a following page.

Selection of Beneficiaries:

Each of the six Regional Federations has the privilege of selecting their own Honorary Award Winner. This individual then has the distinction and privilege of selecting an institution or institutions from within the boundaries of the Federation. In cooperation with that institution, the honoree chooses the two students who each receive a scholarship grant of \$4000.

AFMS Scholarship Foundation, Inc.

This method grants to each Federation the privilege of having its own institution and students as recipients of the Foundation's Grants.

Honorary Award Recipients and Grants to Students:

Grants made by the Foundation are restricted to graduate students who are majoring in one of the Earth Sciences, since our joint interests lie in this field. Currently, two \$4000 grants are given each year in the Rocky Mountain Federation. The first Foundation Scholarship Grant became possible in 1965. Our first Honorary Award Winner was Dr. Richard M. Pearl, associate Professor of Geology at Colorado College. The student he chose to receive our first grant was Victor Lee, who was attending the Colorado School of Mines. The AFMS Scholarship Foundation has awarded more than \$2 million since that time.

AFMS Land Use Policy

- 1. Adherence to the AFMS Code of Ethics assures compliance with most statute and regulations governing collecting on public lands and encourages respect for private property rights and the environment. Clubs are urged to read the AFMS Code of Ethics in at least one meeting every year, to publish the Code frequently in the club newsletter, and to compel compliance on club field trips.
- 2. Individuals and clubs are urged to write their elected representatives and land use management agency supervisors regarding issues of rule making, legislation and enforcement affecting field collecting of minerals and fossils.
- 3. Individuals and clubs are urged to join and support activities of the American Lands Access Association (ALAA), a sister organization with responsibility for advancing the interests of earth science amateurs with legislatures and land use management agencies.
- 4. The AFMS will receive a report from ALAA at its annual meeting.
- 5. The AFMS endorses the principle of multiple use of public lands as a guarantee of continuing recreational opportunities.
- 6. Wilderness and monument designations are inconsistent with the principle of multiple use. In view of the vast amount of public land already designated as wilderness and monuments, future such designations should be minimal, taking into account the increased demand for recreational opportunities, including rockhounding, created by a growing population.
- 7. In furtherance of the principle of multiple use, the AFMS believes that laws, regulations and rules established by relevant governmental authorities should be designed to allow freest possible access to all public lands, coupled with minimal restrictions on the recreational collection of minerals, fossils, gemstone materials and other naturally occurring materials.
- 8. A right to collect minerals and fossils on public lands should be protected by statute.
- 9. The AFMS urges its members to work with any or all government authorities to achieve a good working relationship in order to improve the public image of recreational collectors.

RMFMS Liability Insurance

RMFMS offers a voluntary liability insurance program which protects the club against suits from non-members. The commercial general liability coverage is available for a nominal fee. This would protect a club or club member from a suit by someone who might be injured due to alleged negligence during a club activity. The policy excludes any liability involving cars.

Non-members who submit a claim will have their case reviewed by the insurance claims department. Only then will determination of this situational coverage be made.

An insured member club may obtain Certificate of Insurance from RMFMS Insurance chair. This proof of liability insurance may be specifically issued for an event or location to be used by the RMFMS member club. This "Additionally Named" form must be submitted and approved well in advance of the event. An application for this "Additional Insured" coverage follows.

Other exclusions include damage or injury arising from liquor use, pollutants, cars, boats, airplanes or damage to property in your care, such as tables rented for a show. Items not covered also include falsely describing a product, injury to a club member by another club member, or damage to club property by a club member or other willful acts.

Liability Insurance Q & A

The Federation has a voluntary liability insurance program for those clubs interested in being covered by paying the required premium. This is a Commercial General Liability coverage and provides third party liability coverage. It provides protection from suits from non-members. It does NOT protect "us from ourselves" or "we can't sue ourselves."

Realizing that books have been written on this subject, the brief information contained here is not intended to answer all questions. One better way to understand our coverage is to think of the clubs of the Federation as a family. The household liability insurance you personally have as a family protects you from a suit by someone outside your family who might be injured because of your alleged negligence. An example might be that someone fell on your sidewalk and was injured because you failed to keep it clear of the kids' toys.

The following Q & A statement is prepared by the Rocky Mountain Federation of Mineralogical Societies, Inc. and is the interpretation of the Federation. Any claim must be submitted to the insuring company for final coverage determination.

Q: Does this policy cover every member, including life members? A: Yes.

Q: Are new members covered who join after the premium is paid?
A: Yes, any new members of covered member clubs who join after the premium is paid will be covered for that year automatically by the original premium payment.

Liability Insurance Q & A Cont.....

Q: Are new members covered who join after the premium is paid?

A: Yes, any new members of covered member clubs who join after the premium is paid will be covered for that year automatically by the original premium payment.

Q: How does this insurance relate to existing liability coverage which some members carry as individuals?

A: This liability insurance is primarily for the corporation and societies which make up the Rocky Mountain Federation Federation. The individual would be protected, but only with respect to his or her involvement with the Rocky Mountain Federation and its club activities.

Q: Does this policy cover damage to other people's property in most cases? A: Yes, the policy will provide coverage if someone's property is damaged that is not in the care, custody, and control of the Rocky Mountain Federation. As an example, when you hold your meeting, any damage to the building caused by a member either intentionally or unintentionally would not be covered. But, if the Federation or any of its members accidentally left water on the floor, set up their displays improperly or in some fashion injured someone who was attending the show and was not a member of the club, non-members would be covered for any injuries or damage to their property.

Q: How would this coverage apply to an accident while car pooling on a field trip? A: This liability would not apply to any automobile accidents and as a matter of fact the policy excludes any liability involving automobiles.

Q: Is a non-member guest covered while on a field trip with a covered club member?

A: This is a situation where coverage would most likely be determined only after a claim was submitted to and a complete review of the facts was conducted by the insuring company's claims department.

Q: The availability of a Certificate of Insurance would be important to land owners who often would permit collecting on their land. Are Certificates of Insurance available to the member clubs as proof of insurance?

A: Yes. Certificates of Insurance can be issued to any land owner, hotel or meeting place that may be used by the Federation, showing that the Federation does have liability insurance. Should the land owner, hotel, or meeting place request to be named as an Additional Insured, the insurance company must be notified and the request approved before a Certificate of Insurance could be issued.

Always use common sense to prevent any kind of problem. Follow the safety guidelines. Leave your dogs at home. Prevention is the best policy.

Federation Contests and Awards

Fun Stu%: Rockhounds are a fun-loving group. And they love to let people know about their hobby. The Rocky Mountain Federation of Mineralogical Societies (RMFMS) encourages this love-to-tell by sponsoring various contests each year. It also helps to highlight the clubs in the Federation and the various projects their members are doing. Of course it is GOOD to get trophies and certificates to take back to your club and brag about. And it makes great information to put into local papers to get publicity for your club. Here is a breakdown and brief description of the available contests.

All American Club Contest: Clubs keep a "yearbook" of activities, reports, newsletters, show ads, officers/chairmen, pictures, reports, certificates, and other items that show the club history for the year. The yearbook can be submitted as a printed document (maximum of 100 pages) or as a single pdf file (maximum of 150 pages). Judging criteria include in-person service/member engagement, juniors events, field trips, shows, club library, shop, workshops; virtual promotion of member engagement; publications, publicity; support for Regional Federations, AFMS, and other clubs; in-person community engagement; virtual community engagement; government/legislative relations; format & presentation of the yearbook. See the RMFMS website, rmfms.org, and look under the Resources heading for contest forms. Submission deadline varies. Top three winners receive ribbons and are submitted to the AFMS contest. First place RMFMS winner receives a plaque.

Bulletin Editors Contest: Club editors may enter their bulletin and pieces from their bulletins that were created by club members. Categories include: bulletins, adult articles, adult articles advanced, junior articles, written features, drawn features, photo collage, adult poetry, junior poetry, and special publications. First place in each category receives a plaque. Top five in RMFMS receive ribbons. The top three winners in each category are submitted to the AFMS Bulletin Editors Contest. RMFMS awards are presented at the RMFMS Breakfast with Editors and Webmasters during the RMFMS annual show and convention. The AFMS awards are presented at the AFMS annual show and convention during the AFMS Breakfast with Editors and Webmasters. See the RMFMS website, rmfms.org, and look under the Resources heading for contest forms. Submission deadlines vary and depend on the AFMS show date.

Junior Cash Awards: To encourage juniors to participate in collecting, identifying, and preparing specimens for exhibit, RMFMS gives two cash awards each year at convention. Juniors exhibit a single specimen in one of these categories minerals, lapidary, petrified wood/fossils, jewelry (using a specimen collected in the field). A \$25.00 cash award will be presented to each of the winning entries in the 12 and under age group and the 13-17 age group during the Awards Banquet. Exhibits are prepared and displayed at the annual RMFMS show and convention. Date varies. More information is available from the RMFMS Juniors Program Chair.

Federation Contests and Awards Cont...

New Programs Competition: To promote the production of original programs about the Earth Sciences, lapidary, and all things "rockhound," RMFMS awards a trophy to the first place winner and ribbons to the second and third place winners at the annual RMFMS Awards Banquet. The top three winners are forwarded to the AFMS Programs Contest for judging in the AFMS competition. For more information, contact the New Programs Chair. Forms are on the AFMS website, amfed.org. Under Downloads, look for AFMS Program Competition.

Website Contest: RMFMS clubs are sent an email from the Webmaster Contest Chair with guidelines, entry forms, and scoresheets for the contest. First place winner receives a trophy. Top three winners receive certificates and ribbons. The top two winners are sent to the AFMS Website Contest. RMFMS winners are announced at the annual RMFMS Breakfast with the Editors and Webmasters, held during the annual RMFMS show and convention. Dates vary.

The following are not competitions, but ARE honors/awards presented to members for outstanding service to their clubs and the Federation:

ACROY (AFMS Club Rockhound of the Year): The RMFMS encourages every RMFMS local club to nominate an adult member or married couple and a junior member each year as their AFMS Rockhound of the Year. This is to honor and recognize our club members who are the "unsung heroes." "Every club has at least one. Some clubs may have many. Those may be the folks who are almost always at the meetings. Perhaps they quietly help clean up the room. Or maybe they are the ones who regularly bring items for show and tell, or provide treats, or quietly help others learn about some aspect of the hobby. They are the folks who help keep our hobby going even if they are not the ones who are in the "limelight." Your club may decide on any method to nominate these unsung heroes one time each year. Write up a short description of their service and pass their names, the description, and perhaps a photo on to the RMFMS ACROY Chair. The information will be published in both the RMFMS Newsletter and the AFMS Newsletter.

Gold Pan Award: The Gold Pan Award Committee consists of three people who have previously received this award. The Committee may or may not select a recipient each year, but more than one award may be presented in a given year. The Committee selects individuals, who in the Committee's opinion, have performed outstanding service to the RMFMS. The recipients need not be RMFMS officers. The vote of the Committee will be unanimous. In years when we have recipients, they are awarded a large plaque in recognition of their service during the Awards Banquet, held at the annual RMFMS show and convention.
